Sylvie Retailleau appointed Minister of Higher Education and Research: political and administrative continuity for the University's governance

On Friday 20 May 2022, Sylvie Retailleau, was appointed Minister of Higher Education and Research of the French government. Following her nomination, transitional arrangements have been put in place at Université Paris-Saclay to ensure the institution's political and administrative continuity. Estelle lacona, the University's First Vice President, will assure the role of the University's interim president statutorily until a new president is elected.

The University's governing bodies remain in place and the elected members of the institution's various boards will complete their current mandates until their term of office at the start of 2024. The University must establish an electoral process as outlined in the institution's statutes as swiftly as possible, which will allow the Governing Board to elect a new president in the coming weeks via a call for applications. This call for applications will be made public in the coming days.

In the thirty days following the election, the president will propose to the Governing Board, the Research Commission and the Commission for Education and University Life that they proceed to the election of their respective vice presidents.

The calendar for upcoming electoral operations is currently being drafted, with the objective of establishing an outcome before the summer break.
