Université Paris-Saclay reinstates POLÉTHIS, its Research Ethics and Scientific Integrity Council

POLÉTHIS oversees actions in research ethics and scientific integrity at Université Paris-Saclay. Placed under the authority of the President's office, POLÉTHIS has been given new statutes. The council has just renewed its members and elected Nathalie Guichard as its Chairwoman.

The Research Ethics and Scientific Integrity Council (POLÉTHIS) was established in 2017 as part of the Université Paris-Saclay Community of Universities and Institutions (COMUE). In 2022, it was decided that the council's statutes would be reviewed to align them with the university's new governance model. The new POLÉTHIS council will convene on 27 June with its new Chairwoman, Nathalie Guichard, Professor in Management Science at the Sceaux University Technical Institute (IUT) at Université Paris-Saclay, and specialist in young consumer behaviour and sustainable food practices.

The main missions of POLÉTHIS are to:

- coordinate the university's activities in research ethics and scientific integrity (particularly in education, awareness-raising, research, thinking and sharing of viewpoints on the ethics of research projects and scientific integrity), by encouraging the synergies between these activities, which remain the responsibility of the body or person coordinating them,
- lead thinking on research ethics and scientific integrity within Université Paris-Saclay and beyond,
- advise the President's office on research ethics and scientific integrity issues and, upon the request of the President's office, the Governing Board or the Academic Council, provide viewpoints and recommendations on subjects linked to its field of expertise,
- monitor current subjects and debates in research ethics and scientific integrity, remaining attentive to emerging subjects.

The council is made up of fifteen members, appointed by the university's presidential office for a period of four years. These include the university's scientific integrity advisor, the ethics advisor, the chair of the university's Research Ethics Committee and the head of the Department for Legal and Institutional Affairs. Three members were put forward by the university's Academic Council from among its own members, including a PhD candidate; two were proposed by the Governing Board, equally from among its own members, one was put forward by the PhD Policy Committee from among its own members, and five were appointed directly by the university's presidential office from staff members working in the university's constituent faculties and institutes, *Grandes Écoles*, associate institutions and partnering national research organisations.
