2. **Butte Montmartre** : An area with authentic charm, famous for the « Basilique du Sacré Cœur » and its magnificent view of Paris.





7. **Canal St Martin from Jaures to Republique** : The Saint-Martin canal is a 4.55 km long canal located mainly in the 10^e and 11^e arrondissements of Paris. It connects the basin of La Villette - and beyond the canal de l'Ourcq - to the port of l'Arsenal which communicates with the Seine. It is a small canal originally intended for the supply of drinking water in the capital. Inaugurated in 1825, it includes nine locks and two swing bridges with a total height difference of 25 m.

8. **Coulée verte Rene Dumont** from the Mairie of the 12th to Gare de Lyon.
La coulée verte René-Dumont, formerly Promenade plantée, is a linear park in the 12^e arrondissement of Paris, France. Located on the route of an old railway line, it extends from Place de la Bastille to the boulevard périphérique, Porte de Montempoivre.

10. La Petite Ceinture : The Petite Ceinture de Paris line is an old 32-kilometre double-track railway line that runs around Paris within the boulevards des Maréchaux. Opened in sections from 1852 to 1869, it was first exclusively dedicated to freight traffic before being opened to passenger traffic, with the exception of the section between Auteuil-Boulogne and Pont-Cardinet stations, known as the "Auteuil line", opened to passenger traffic in 1854 and only in 1867 for freight traffic.





11. Parc de Sceaux The Parc de Sceaux, the entire domain of Sceaux, is owned by the Hauts-de-Seine department and its park extends over the territories of the communes of Sceaux and Antony. The park was designed by André Le Nôtre at the end of the XVII^e century at the request of Colbert and then his son the Marquis de Seignelay. During the Revolution, through the speculations of the Black Band, the estate was looted, sold to a farmer, and both the castle and the waterfalls were destroyed. A new castle was built in 1856 by his daughter, married to the Duke of Treviso.

== Exhibitions ==

1. Le Grand Palais :

The Grand Palais is a Parisian monument located on the Champs-Élysées, facing the Petit Palais, from which it is separated by Avenue Winston-Churchill in the arrondissement 8^e. Its 77,000 m² regularly hosts prestigious trade fairs and exhibitions.

2. Le Centre Pompidou :

The Georges-Pompidou National Art and Culture Centre - commonly known as the "Georges-Pompidou Centre", "Pompidou Centre" or "Beaubourg Centre", and colloquially as the "Beaubourg" - is a polycultural establishment born of the will of President Georges Pompidou, a great lover of modern art, to create in the heart of Paris an original cultural institution entirely dedicated to modern and contemporary creation where the visual arts would coexist with books, design, music and film.



3. La Fondation Louis Vuitton

The Louis Vuitton Corporate Foundation, formerly the Louis Vuitton Corporate Foundation for Creation, launched in October 2006, was created by the LVMH group and its companies. Its objective is to perpetuate the sponsorship actions undertaken by the group since 1990.



4. Le Musée du Quai Branly

The musée du quai Branly - Jacques-Chirac or musée des arts et civilisations d'Afrique, d'Asie, d'Océanie et des Amériques is located at quai Branly in the 7^e arrondissement de Paris, along the quai de la Seine which gives it its name and at the foot of the Eiffel Tower. The project, led by Jacques Chirac and carried out by Jean Nouvel, was inaugurated on June 20, 2006. Attendance stands at nearly 1,500,000 visitors in 2014 and has surpassed the 10 million mark in 2016 since it opened, making it one of the most popular in its category in the world.
