All documents in the same category must be merged into a single PDF

Photocopy of passport (identity page) or idenity papers Please note that a copy of your passport will be required if you are selected by the University Paris-Saclay
Curriculum vitae written in French or English (1 to 2 pages)
Class ranking (with number of students in the program) optional
Transcripts of post-secondary grades
Post-secondary Diplomas
Certificate or diploma in the language of instruction for the intended program if it's not your native language
Motivation letter / Professional project, written in French or in English (1 to 2 pages). The applicant should write their project in a way that explains the choice of studies in France in relation to previous studies and the future professional career.
Letters of recommendation from academic and professional references (max 3 letters)
