- Promoting and sharing your work
- Securing your authorship and protecting your thesis against plagiarism
- Increasing your visibility, freely and free of charge
- Contributing to the advancement of research

Different dissemination options

Please note that some details of your thesis will be made public on the internet (titles, keywords, and abstracts), no matter which dissemination option you chose

Option 1 – You would like your thesis to be available online:

The full text of the thesis will be available online after the validation of your final deposit

 Option 2 – You would like your thesis to be available online after an embargo period: Embargo = withholding the online availability of your thesis (up to 5 years. Can be extended beyond that upon substantiated request 1 year after the defense at the earliest)

For example: you might still be in the process of publishing certain parts or results from your thesis

• Your thesis will still be available on request to the thesis department, on-site or to any member of the French academic community

- Once the embargo is lifted, your thesis will be available online
- Option 3 For legal reasons, you would like parts but not the whole of your thesis to be available online:

For example: You might have included copyrighted material without taking the necessary precautions or asking for the required authorizations.

You need to submit 2 versions of your thesis: a complete version and an edited version

• The complete version will be available on request to the thesis department, on-site,

- or to any member of the French academic community
 - The edited version will be available online

> A distinct option: confidentiality (patent application or classified information)

- Apply for confidentiality by addressing a request to the Director of your institution 3 months before your defense
 - During the confidentiality period, your thesis will not be available to anyone
 - Once the confidentiality is lifted, your thesis will be available online right away or

after an additional embargo period
