- Promoting and sharing your work
- Securing your authorship and protecting your thesis against plagiarism
- Increasing your visibility, freely and free of charge
- Contributing to the advancement of research

# Differents modes of acess

## Whatever the mode of access chosen, please note that some details of your thesis will be made publicly available on the Internet (titles, keywords and abstracts)

#### Option 1 : You would like your thesis to be available on the Internet : the full text of the thesis will be available online

## Option 2 : You would like your thesis to be available on the Internet after an embargo period (usually between 1 month and 2 years):

*For example* : you might still be in the process of publishing certain parts or results from your thesis

- Your thesis will be available in the library for reading for the duration of the embargo
- After the embargo period, your thesis will be disseminated ont the Internet

# In Adum, tick the box allowing your thesis to be disseminated on the Internet!

## Option 3 : For legal reasons, you would like parts but not the whole of your thesis to be available on the Internet:

*For example :* this may be because your thesis includes copyright material (diagrams, drawings, tables and articles) which you don't have permission to reproduce.

In this case, you need to submit 2 versions of your thesis : a complere version AND a version which excludes such content as should not be disseminated

- The complete version of your thesis will be available for consultation in the library
- The shorter version will be made publicly available on the Internet

# Option 4: You do not wish your thesis to be disseminated on the Internet

In this case, your thesis will only be available for consultation in the University library

# Special Case : confidentiality

You can apply for dissemination to be restricted on the grounds of confidentiality by making a request to the Director of your institution (or his/her representative) 3 months before your defense

- Your thesis will not be available either in the University library or in the Internet
- At the end of the confidentiality period, your thesis will be accessible on the Internet or in université the University library depending on the level of access you have selected PARIS-SACLAY
